As we approach Easter, we're also thrilled to announce our Easter - Cross Factor Hope Journey events. This year, we will host five schools, with 180 students coming to the church to explore the story of Easter and discover the profound love of Christ through their own 'journeys'. Our Hope Journey events are a highlight for local schools, offering an interactive way for young people and staff to engage with the Easter story. Year 5 students will participate in six workshops, each one shedding light on different aspects of the Easter story—

understanding more about the resurrection, recognising the symbolism of the cross, encountering a Roman Centurion, becoming part of the highs and lows of the Easter week, taking part in the Last Supper and enjoy a craft activity. This experience allows them to gain a deeper understanding of why Easter is central to our Christian faith.

Our ongoing work with young people continues to be a source of joy. It's been wonderful to see new faces at the Sparkz kids' club and the Ablaze youth group. More than just growth in numbers, it's been heartening to see young people retain and share what they've learned from the Bible. My hope is that they will continue to share these stories with their families at home. Over half term, we also organized a walk up Shutlingsloe, with seven of us enjoying a brief but rewarding hike up the Cheshire hill and back through Macclesfield Forest.



One quote that has resonated with me recently comes from John C. Maxwell: "Change is inevitable. Growth is optional." As many of you are aware, change is happening—both within Wesley Place and perhaps in your own lives. Change can be unsettling, but it's how we respond to that fear that makes all the difference. Do we allow fear to control us, or do we trust that God is already at work in these changes? Though it's a challenge, we are not alone in this journey. Jesus walks with us every step of the way, assuring us that we will never face more than we can bear. Come, Holy Spirit!

What a refreshing change from the downward spiral we often perceive ourselves to be in across so much of Methodism!


